

# Climate Emergency: November Challenge

Maribyrnong, Rochester, Charlton, Murchison, Wangaratta in Victoria. Hawkesbury, Warragamba, Lismore in New South Wales.



All names of places in Eastern Australia, from where I am writing this article, which are badly affected by floods. **Dr Simon Bradshaw, the Climate Council's Director of Research, said**:

# Chas Keys, former deputy director-general of the NSW State Emergency Service and Emergency Leaders for Climate Action member added

"We know that extreme weather disasters are only going to get worse due to climate change.......Of course, governments also need to be acting on climate change to stop these events from intensifying further, starting with an end to new coal and gas projects in Australia."

# Robert Quirk, a farmer from NSW, said: "

This is not the news we wanted to hear. I'm worried about how people in Lismore will cope with a wet spring. These massive rain events will keep happening unless we do something urgently to cut our emissions to protect our farms in the future."

This follows years of drought, catastrophic fires in 2019. Now 3 years of floods.

I share this as it shows how across the globe we are all impacted by climate change. CO2 emissions causing global heating and climate emergency.

# Our challenge this month is to choose a country you know and find out how climate change is affecting the people there.

Learn and think about your global neighbour. Remember also last month's challenge to write to your MP to say that our government need to keep the climate emergency high on their agenda, ( it is our agenda! ).


