As the years have passed, I have grown in my appreciation of her and her contribution of the life of our nation. I have especially appreciated her gentle, but firm affirmation of her Christian faith.

And now she rests in the arms of her Lord, and waits with all the faithful departed for that time when her Lord and mine declares: Behold, I make all things new! Then there will be a new heavens and a new earth, and a new beginning, So I pray:

May she rest in peace, and rise in glory

Kingswood Foodbank News:



Yesterday (23rd Sep 2022) was a record day. We served 32 clients, a figure I cannot recall ever reaching before, except at Christmas. We, and you who give us donations, fed 44 adults and 41 children.

For the volunteers it was bad day and not just because of the numbers we fed. Well before we served our last client, we had run out of a number of items meaning that those who came in towards the end did not get a full package. This is a situation we hate. There is a risk that those who will come in next Tuesday will also not get everything we normally give out.

We are completely out of deodorant, hair conditioner, non bio washing powder, washing up liquid, tins of toms, custard and rice pudding. We also have very low stocks of tins of meat & fruit, soup, toothpaste, coffee, drinking chocolate, cartons of long-life milk & fruit juice, biscuits, razors, pot noodles, sauces, toilet roll and crisps.

SOUTH GLOUCESTERSHIRE COUNCIL.

(Oldbury Lane, Wick) (Temporary Prohibition of Use by Vehicles, Foot Passengers,
Pedal Cycles and Equestrians) Order 2022

Notice is hereby given that South Gloucestershire District Council in pursuance of the provisions of section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended intends to make an order the effect of which will be to close, temporarily, to vehicles, foot passengers, pedal cycles and equestrians that length of Oldbury Lane which extends from its junction with Barrow Hill in a south westerly direction for a distance of 200 metres.

This order is required for the following reason: in connection with the likelihood of danger to the public consequent upon fire hydrant installation works on or adjacent to the highway. The order will be operative from 2 November 2022 for a maximum period of eighteen months. The closure however may not be implemented for the whole of the period but only when traffic signs are in position and only for so long as is necessitated by the works which are anticipated to be of 3 days duration.

Alternative route: Barrow Hill, A420, A4175, Redfield Hill, Beach Hill, Beach Lane and vice versa

Our September meeting opened with a prayer of thanks for the life of dedication and service of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

Our guest speaker, Matt from Julian House charity, which supports vulnerable and at-risk individuals, explained that every year Julian House charity supports over 1800 vulnerable individuals. These include adults and young people experiencing homelessness, escaping domestic abuse, adults with learning difficulties and people who need support after leaving prison. Julian House charity operates more than 40 different projects, accommodation sites and social enterprises across South West England. These include homeless outreach services, a 20-bed emergency access hostel and various supported accommodation. Additionally, Julian House runs multiple training programmes (including bike workshops in Bath and Trowbridge) to help people regain confidence, learn new transferable work skills, get back into education, volunteering and employment.

Several WI members have now signed up to the Julian House Fundraising Event – Circuit of Bath 20-mile challenge to raise help raise sponsorship to help support the many men and women experiencing homelessness and escaping domestic abuse across the South West. Appointment of the new Vicar

Now that Rev Tm Bell has left we have to appoint a new vicar and we would like your views on the sort of person we should be seeking. In the Church of England, the whole country is divided into parishes, each with one or two churches and overseen by a Parochial Church Council (PCC) made up of members of the community who act like the trustees of a charity. Smaller parishes are grouped together into a Benefice which is run by a vicar. A Bishop oversees all of the churches in an area known as a Diocese. Rev Tim was in charge of Wick Benefice which consists of the two parishes of Wick, and Doynton and Dyrham, and is part of the Diocese of Bristol.

To appoint a new vicar, each Parish first has to prepare a Parish Profile to describe what it is looking for in the new vicar and the sort of things it would like them to focus on. An advert is placed in the Church Times and the Diocese website, and any ordained priest can apply for the post. There is then shortlisting and interviews conducted by two PCC members from each parish, and a representative from the Diocese. News from the D&H Chronicle Archive

The September 1962 edition of the Chronicle featured a news item entitled 'Thunderstorm Observations'. Young reporters Douglas Densley and Roger Hillier reported the following: 'Mr Girdlestone is the voluntary observer for the district in a nationwide survey of thunderstorms. The survey is being made by the Electrical Research Association. Every time we have a thunderstorm Mr Girdlestone has to record the date, time, duration of storm, severity and number of lightning flashes to earth'. In church news it was reported that 'Mr Trustler was shooting stray deer in the churchyard last week.' Work was also reported to be going on at Dyrham Church: 'There is scaffolding right to the top of the tower and the west window is out.'


Classes will run until the 1st of December 2022 with a break for Christmas and resume on the 5th January 2023.

Climate Emergency: October Challenge

Autumn has come, and you may have seen that that the trees lost their leaves early. A "false Autumn", we are told, caused by a dry and hot July and August, caused by the change in our local climate this summer. Here in Wick and the West country we are not used to seeing parched, brown grass and fields. Climate change is happening for us. This months challenge is ADVOCACY. We need to advocate or encourage our government to do more about the climate emergency.

Some facts: At last years big climate meeting in Glasgow, COP26, world leaders agreed to meet in 2022, to pledge further cuts to emissions of carbon dioxide (CO2) - a greenhouse gas which causes climate change. This is to try to keep temperature rises within 1.5C - which scientists say is required to prevent a "climate catastrophe". Current pledges, if met, will only limit global warming to about 2.4C. COP 27 is meeting in November in Egypt to continue the discussions.

Climate change: Is the UK on track to meet its targets?

The UK Committee on Climate Change, which advises the government, thinks not. It has criticised the plans to meet the country's climate goals. The UK has pledged to reduce its greenhouse-gas emissions to net zero by 2050. Is this fast enough? Net zero means a country takes as much of these climate-changing gases out of the atmosphere as it puts in. More info at: https://www.bbc.co.uk/news/58160547

What can we do?

- -Keep informed about what our government is doing. News, internet etc.
- -We can write to our MP, who represents us at the government, to say that the UK government must take more action and not just talk; such as:

To reduce green house gases, like CO2, and at least keep to the targets set Continue to promote renewable energy and reduce use of fossil fuels like coal, oil and gas

Plant more trees and protect the natural environment (like green belt land)

To support efforts in poorer, developing countries to combat the impact of climate change (like in Pakistan and the devastating floods there recently).

Roof Project at St Peter's Church , Dyrham



As I outlined in the last newsletter, St Peter's Church in Dyrham needs significant repair work to the roof and interior to stop water coming in and repair the damage this has caused over the years.

There are three phases to this: replacing the Tower Roof (estimated cost £113,000); replacing the lead valleys above the aisles (estimated £42,000); redecorating the interior (estimated £30,000).

We have so far raised £31,000 from grants towards the valleys and decoration, and several thousand pounds in donations from visitors and the community. Further applications are being made, but unfortunately our first submission to the Heritage Lottery Fund was not successful. Whilst the fund accepted it was a significant piece of heritage that was at risk, they deemed that it did not contain detailed enough long-term plans beyond the repairs to meet "mandatory participation outcomes". The fund could be a source of a significant portion of the funds for the tower roof, so the intention is to involve the community in developing these plans and submit a new application. In the meantime, the priority is to continue fundraising and press on with the replacement of the valleys which present the greatest risk of leaking again and causing structural damage. 


