From Rev'd Peter Hallett

The signals we give each other are important — they can lead to joy or sorrow. Of course, sometimes we give signals we didn't mean to; or, just as bad, we give signals that are misunderstood. I learned a long time ago that in all communication, it's not what you say that counts, it's what they hear!

So, there I was sat at the roundabout on Marsham Way, waiting to turn left into the shopping precinct to go to Boots. There was an almost constant stream of traffic coming round the roundabout from the opposite direction and pulling off into the same exit that wanted to use. The thing was just about every car that bothered to signal at all, was signalling right, that is 'into the roundabout'. This means, according to the Highway Code, they plan not to pull off, but to carry on round. If I'd acted in line with their signals there would have been a nasty accident!

Signals are important.

But it isn't just when we're driving. It's about relationships as well. Not least in the relationships we have with those who are nearest and dearest to us. It's the bread and butter of dramas on the TV. It happened in a drama I watched on TV last night. There was tension between a couple, and the woman went to the man to share some news that would have changed everything for the better. But the man was so sure he knew what she was going to say, he anticipated it and put the words in her mouth, and she couldn't get a word in edgeways. The rift in their relationship became a chasm.

It's not what you say, it's what they hear.

What ought to be easy is sometimes so hard. To listen. To allow for the fact you may have the wrong end of the stick. What can make the difference? Love, trust. I don't mean "being in love" – I means love in the sense that St Paul uses in his letter to the Corinthians: "Love is patient, love is kind...it is not easily angered...It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails" (See the whole passage at 1 Corinthians 13:4 onwards)

Our loving Heavenly Father sends signals as well – signals that speak of his loving care. I guess the question is: what do we see? what do we hear? Maybe our trusting makes all the difference.

News from St Bartholomew's

As you may know, we have been linked, historically, with Abson church for many, many years. St James the Great was our "Mother Church" originally, with St Bartholomew's being a "Chapel of Ease" when it was first built (1846, consecrated in 1850) and only being made a separate parish some 30 years later. That link is set to grow stronger in the coming months, as Bristol Diocese plan to link our Benefice (the group of churches of Wick, Dyrham and Doynton) with the Benefice that contains Pucklechurch and Abson.

This is not expected to be a quick process! But we are beginning by making it clear to any potential applicants to our Vicar vacancy that they will be responsible for 5 parishes, and that they will take an active part in bringing the two groups together. So, exciting times ahead. Parish Reps from all five churches have had passports carefully examined and undergone strict border checks* in order to meet up and get the ball rolling. We have a lot of support from the Diocese and if all goes smoothly, not much will change on a day-to-day basis. We might see a new face leading services now and then, or be aware that our familiar clergy faces are elsewhere, and events and services may appear in the magazine. Not too earth-shattering. As a start, the congregation at Pucklechurch invited us to join them at a service on Ash Wednesday, (22nd Feb) with the Bishop presiding. Lots of us went, from all three of "our" churches, and it was a lovely experience: a beautiful church, a warm and friendly welcome and a decent cuppa! We all felt that it was a very good beginning, and bodes well for the future. Bishop Viv was very down-to-earth and relatable, acknowledging our emerging new group and giving us an interesting and thought-provoking sermon to boot. Here's to the future!

Doynton Hard Half Marathon – February 5th 2023. A horribly hilly cross-country race involving around 500 runners, 130 volunteers and many spectators. This annual event organized by Emersons Green Running Club takes runners on a challenging tour of the countryside over three separate and distinctly different sections, each returning to Doynton village. After many (many, many) months of planning the BIG day finally arrived. The organizers had been doing



their weather dances for the last six months and this year it paid off, a sunny crisp day, perfect for all involved. Massive thanks to the landowners, Parish Council, local businesses, cadets and the residents of Doynton, Dyrham, Wick, Abson and Pucklechurch, who gave up their time, parking premises and driveways and came out in force to support the event; from marshals to water stations, tea and cake stands, supporters and confused passers-by, everyone was amazing. Teas at the half-marathon raised £1100 for Bath Welcomes Refugees.

TOO MOMEN

During our February meeting members enjoyed an inspirational talk on Managing the Menopause by guest speaker and WI member Maria Card (Advanced Nurse Practitioner). Maria ran us through the female Menopause journey and how declining Oestrogen levels can trigger menopausal symptoms and the importance of seeking professional medical support to investigate hormonal or non-hormonal pathway options. Additionally, Maria emphasised the significance of embracing holistic evidence-based approaches to improve health and well-being for example, maintaining good bone health through weight and muscle bearing exercises, focusing on good sleep hygiene, nurture positive friendships and reduce work life stress balance. Maria gave us an insight into her daily working life as an advanced nurse practitioner and how her role has extended to supporting women in an NHS Complex Menopause clinic.

HOW TO WELCOME WILD BEES INTO YOUR GARDEN

Did you know that bees provide us with every third mouthful of food we eat? Without bees, we'd be unable to grow lots of favourite foods, including tomatoes, blueberries and green beans. They are vital, and they need help. What can you do to encourage bees?



Top tip! Relax about weeds in your lawn. Some, such as daisies and clover are actually really good food sources for bees

Plant bee friendly flowers: nectar and pollen-rich flowers

Plant a mixture of plants that flower over a long period to give as much of a food source as possible. Our Plants for Pollinators lists have lots of information on plants for different seasons.

Make a bug hotel: Create and protect potential nesting sites

There are hundreds of different types of wild bees in Britain, and they choose a variety of places to set up home. Buy or make a 'bug hotel' to provide habitat for bees and lots of other wildlife - it's a particularly fun job for children.

Provide both long and short grass

Having both long and short grass in your garden creates potential nesting sites for a range of bee species. Try leaving an area of your lawn to grow longer and planting bulbs and meadow flowers - it will look great and wildlife will love it.

Minimise use of garden chemicals

Try to avoid using chemicals like pesticides in your garden. Instead, encourage natural predators like beetles which will eat the pests for you. Log piles and compost heaps are useful habitats for our garden allies.

Make a small garden pond: Provide a water source

Bees need a drink too! If you've got space, why not create a wildlife pond.? Alternatively, how about a pot sunk into the ground or a birdbath containing a few part-submerged rocks to enable bees to reach the water?

Prune roses and budlea


