

# **Easter stories**

For as long as humans have been able to communicate, we have told ourselves stories in an attempt to explain the mysteries of life, the suffering that is an unavoidable part of it, and the certainty of its end. These stories help us to remember; they teach us and guide our behaviour. And there are always multiple, often conflicting, versions of every such story.

Several years ago, I was one of three witnesses to a particular event. It took over a year for the case to come to court but the three of us were all sure of what we had seen and experienced. It turned out that our recollections were each very slightly different and this convinced the jury that we were lying. In fact, if we had been making it up, we would have made sure we "got our story straight" – a word-perfect testimony would have been indicative of collusion.

One of the most important and perplexing stories in our culture is the story of Easter. Each of the gospels tells the story of the first Easter Day in some significantly different ways. You would think that, if the authors had got together to make up the story, they would have made sure all the details matched. Also, the women who followed Jesus played leading roles in all of the Easter stories. They were the first at the tomb and the first to go and tell the news. In the first century world, women were not regarded as credible witnesses. So, again, if you were making these stories up after the event, you simply would not have used women as your primary witnesses.

Without the story of the resurrection, we might never have heard of Jesus of Nazareth. How different would the world be if he had been just one of the many thousands crucified by the Romans who were never heard of again?

In previous years, it was the repository of dead flowers and trimmed branches, and formed the nucleus of our annual November bonfire. But recently it has become regarded more and more as a place to fling rubbish, and there was a LOT of plastic and cellophane etc. Hopefully, all the plastic has been dug out, and when it has dried a little, we will have one final burning. Then it will be raked, cleared, and seeded. It won't be long before graves need to be dug very near there, `so we want to be ready.

Don't forget our Easter services: all three churches are offering a service on Easter Sunday, with various levels of solemnity and/or chocolate or hot cross buns and there are services on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, too - all info on the centre pages.

Maggie Curtis, a Wick resident writes:

# <u>The British Red Cross – Warmley, Bristol – would</u> you like to help?



I have been a volunteer at the British Red Cross Mobil-

ity Aids Centre, Warmley for 2 years now. I came across the vacancy through the "Can Do Bristol" website as I was keen to do some volunteering work.

Before starting I had to take several Red Cross online courses covering: its history and how it has grown to the world wide recognised and respected organisation it is today and the 7 principles of the British Red Cross which all its staff adheres to, which are: Humanity, Impartiality, Neutrality, Unity, Independence, Universality and Voluntary Service. I was also very interested to learn that out of the 198 countries in the world, 196 have their own Red Cross Movement – all based on the same 7 principles – so being part of the British Red Cross one does really feel part of a World Wide family. The British Red Cross is not a Christian movement (or any other religion) however its 7 principles sit very well within our Christian framework. I also learnt that pre-covid figures were some 2,000 paid employees and 17,000 volunteers – amazing!

At the **Warmley Mobility Aids Centre** we hire out mobility aids which can help a family/individual in post –trauma/hospital discharge/holiday assistance etc. My role involves serving clients who are hiring or returning equipment, chasing up overdue equipment and answering the phone. This is the part I like the best as you never know what the caller is going to tell you – from a general enquiry about equipment available, to a distressing call following an accident/trauma which of course can happen to anyone at any age. There are many occasions when I have thought how fortunate I am.

From the Warmley Hub another service operates: First Call. This service offers practical help to those leaving hospital or helping those where their circumstances have suddenly changed, and can range from organising a lift home, to getting the shopping in, or making a regular phone call to check the person is OK....a hugely valuable and rewarding role....

There are **lots** of opportunities at Warmley if you feel you could also contribute – you can volunteer like I do in "reception", or the warehouse are always looking for people to help service the equipment – or there are driving roles too (paid or voluntary) where you could be delivering or collecting equipment.

# Women's Institute

During our March meeting members enjoyed a talk by Professional Baker Drew McGreal on The Art of Artisan European Bread Making. Members had the opportunity to taste a variety of breads ranging from the German Rye Loaf, Savoury Pretzels to the Focaccia accompanied by dips, smoked meats and cheese to enhance the taste. Members learnt about the 1920 baguette law - a real baquette has only four ingredients - flour, water, yeast and salt and it is baked in a steam oven to give its crispiness, it must weigh between 250g-300g and be no longer than 65cm. Plus the history of the sourdough and fermented bread dating back 5000 years.




