Let us look out for each other as the weather gets cold and love our neighbour as ourselves. Let us pray for a better life together, whatever the future brings us.

News from the D&H Archive

During the 1960s the Dyrham & Hinton Chronicle was published by a group of students from the village primary school. An archive of the surviving issues gives a unique window into our shared past. The September 1963 edition of

the Chronicle featured the following news item entitled "No Holiday for Twenty Years":

Living at Dyrham Park Top Lodge and working every day in the clean fresh air, some people might say that Mr Trustler's life was one long holiday, but they ought to try it in winter! Early this year the snow was twelve feet high in some places and Mr and Mrs Trustler didn't see anybody for a fortnight. It was easy for the deer to walk out of the park, over the crisp snow and it was impossible to stop them straying. During the summer Mr Trustler has been busy mending the three miles of walls round the park. He quarries his own stone. For a change of occupation there are always the thistles to cut down!

September Environment challenge

How has your summer been? Times for R and R maybe, despite the rather wet days (of course starting with the school holidays)?



I have been reflecting on how the year has been so far for the farming community in which we live. We are blessed to live in a village surrounded by green fields and farms.

In terms of the weather, 2023 started off as normal and then the hot dry months of May and June. Walking the footpaths, you could see the crops beginning to wilt, is suffer from lack of rain. This will have an impact on the final yield as we come to harvest time.

Did you notice that the grass for hay and silage was cut early this year, as the hot months hastened the growth?



Then in late July rain came and has continued, great for our gardens and grass- but when it didn't stop in August farmers worried about the harvest of wheat, and barley as the grain is wet in the field and the ground soggy for the harvesting machines. Thankfully a few dry days in August has helped and harvest has started apace.

Farmers face many challenges due to the changing climate; "Climate change continues to pose significant challenges for agriculture. With expected greater volatility in crop yields due to climate change, implementing climate-resilient farming practices such as drought-resistant crops, conservation tillage, and effective water management will be critical."

This alongside rising cost of fuel, fertilizer, seeds and other inputs. For pig producers, shortage of labour for the slaughter houses; for poultry farmers, bird flu impacted on egg production. Did you notice?

"How can we help our farmers"? is our challenge for this month:

Be mindful and aware of what they face? Buy local and buy British to support the home-grown industry. Don't gripe if we have to pay a bit more, so farmers get a fair price. Be thankful for our farmers- they do a great job feeding us and the nation.
