It is almost unbearably heartbreaking to contemplate the fear and terror experienced by children caught up in scenes of unspeakable violence and bloodshed, of families under relentless bombardment, desperately seeking safety, where safety cannot be found.

Jesus, very much a man of the Middle East, was unequivocal in his condemnation of those who harm children: “If any of you put a stumbling block before one of these little ones who believe in me, it would be better for you if a great millstone were fastened around your neck and you were drowned in the depth of the sea.”

One of those believed to have been taken hostage from Israel in the recent terror attacks is a 75-year-old Canadian-Israeli woman called Vivian Silver. A renowned peace campaigner, she helped found an organisation called “Women Wage Peace” which has worked for peace for many years, together with the Palestinian women’s peace movement. We may feel impotent in the face of what is happening in the world, but, as our own society becomes more and more polarised, with people spouting all kinds of hatred online, may we choose to wage peace, in our families, in our community, in our places of work and in our schools, for the sake of our children and grandchildren.

News from St Bartholomew's

We have had our Quinquennial inspection (*every 5 years an architect comes and gives the buildings a thorough going over*), and it has given us some food for thought. **Every** inspection mentions the roof (I think it is the law that church roofs have to be in some state of disrepair, and be in need of fund-raising) but this time, the windows have also been commented on. We did a bit of "research" (some serious Googling and reading of websites) and asked a specialist stained glass company based in Swindon to come and give us the benefit of their advice. We are awaiting his full report, but it definitely looks like we have some work ahead of us, and some fund-raising to do. Expect to see the giant thermometer in the churchyard any day!

Another thing that the architect mentioned was that the trees in the churchyard had grown so much that they were blocking the view of the church from the road. Now, that's something we can get to grips with immediately, ourselves, so we discussed and decided, then set to (on Friday 13th, with chainsaws. Intrepid, or mad?) and cleared away a vast amount of unwanted growth. We took several large bags - the sort you get topsoil delivered in, so seriously large - to the recycling centre, but there is still a pile of branches to go. If you feel the urge to chop 'em up and put them in the bags that are lurking by the porch, do not stifle it! Even 10 mins of chopping would make a difference to the pile. **(Please don't chop down trees that haven't yet been touched though, for obvious safety reasons)**

Our search for a new vicar continues: the advert on the Diocesan website generated some interest, and we are moving along with the process. We will bring you news as we get it.

In the meantime, our adventure into lay-led worship continues, and is proving very successful. The next All Together service, on 5th Nov, will be led by Steve and Cathy Burgess, and is sure to be interesting.



Put a date in your diaries for the December one, as it is Advent Sunday, 3rd Dec, and will be the start of all the carol singing! (Plus, a little plug for the Nine Lessons and Carols on the 17th: no sermon, beautiful music, just like the Carols from Kings you see on the telly on Christmas Eve!) Christmas Eve sees the ever-popular Crib Service at 3pm. Come dressed as a character from the Nativity Story (*we have lots of costumes available for the children, but grown ups will have to supply their own haloes and tea-towel head-dresses*) and hear the Greatest Story told under the twinkling fairy lights.

Friends of Doynton Church Pauline Blacker writes: I would like to convey my thanks to all those people who attended the Harvest/Friends service on Sunday September 24th. Our thanks go to Steve Burgess, who led the service, and all the ladies who kindly made delicious cakes. This year we raised £2,575 including Gift Aid. It means that over the past four years we have received a total of £19,322. This money is used to help with the ongoing maintenance costs of the Church. - **Village hall roof:** repairs to the village hall roof have now been completed. This has included renewing some of the timber structure and several valleys due to wet rot damage. Our thanks to Cllr Rich Stallard for leading this project.
- **Grants:** Wick Guides - the Council voted to grant £750.00 to Wick Guides in support of their away camp next year in Northern Ireland.
- **Planning:**

P23/02611/RVC – Carpenters Arms, 10 Church Road. Removal of condition 4 relating to the parking schedule attached to planning permission P21/00712/F. *The PC voted to object to this application on the grounds of pedestrian safety, vehicle manoeuvring visibility and emergency vehicle access.*

P23/02784/HH – 18 St Helens Drive. Erection of single storey rear and side extension to provide additional living accommodation. *No objection.*
- **Speed data project July/August 2023:**

Naishcombe Hill downhill – 48% of drivers exceed the 30mph limit and 18% of drivers could be prosecuted.

A420 High Street both ways – 75% of drivers exceed the 30mph limit and 34% of drivers could be prosecuted.

A420 London Road both ways – 88% of drivers exceed the 30mph limit and 58% of drivers could be prosecuted.

This data has been passed to Avon & Somerset Police for action.

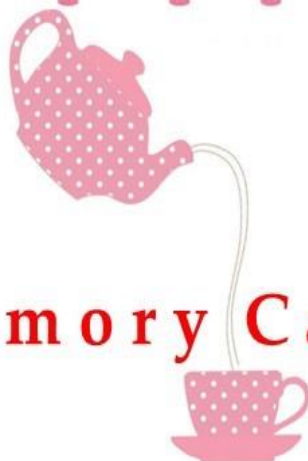

November Environment Challenge



SPLAT! In the past, driving a car on an evening, the windscreen would be hit by many insects. But now, WHAT DO we experience?
Maybe due to more aerodynamic cars, but the truth is:

UK's flying insects have declined by 60% in 20 years

The UK's insect population has fallen sharply as the invertebrates are affected by rising temperatures and fragmented habitats. The major causes of these declines are believed to be related to agriculture. The use of pesticides and fertilisers is killing insects, while the conversion of meadows, woodland and hedgerows into pasture and fields is also having a damaging effect. So reports the Natural History Museum.

The decline will impact our food supply as less insects means less pollination of the crops and flowers we need.

While the declines are dramatic, small changes to our homes and gardens can play a significant part to support insects. **This is the challenge for November:**

Growing **insect-friendly plants** in gardens and even window boxes can help provide food for pollinators and other invertebrates.

In your garden, **cutting your grass less** is another way to make the world to be more insect-friendly. Not only does this save time and effort, but it promotes the growth of wildflowers that pollinators and other insects depend on.

Leave an area of your garden to long grass can provide space for insects to lay their eggs, and shelter from predators. **Creating log piles** can help protect beetles, as well as adding nutrients to the soil.

It's important that we understand how insect populations continue to change. Taking part in community science projects such as **Bugs Matter** can help keep track of the unprecedented ways in which our world is changing.

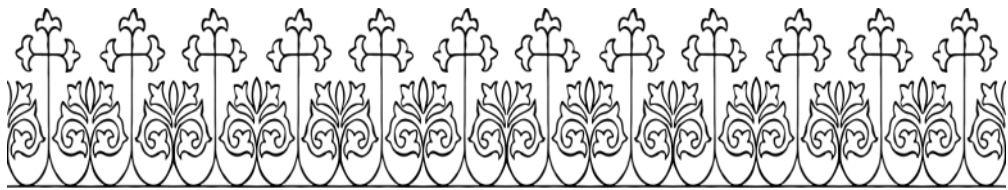
