One of the abiding memories I have of my mother was that she was incredibly timid. She was scared of everything! She didn't like going places on her own - indeed, she didn't do it. On one occasion she wanted to see a film showing at our local cinema, *A Night to Remember*. On this occasion I was the chosen one. So, off I went to see this film with her. It was released in 1958, when I was 9 years old. I didn't know what it was about before I went — afterwards I never forgot.

It was about the sinking of the Titanic.

It wasn't like the 1997 version of the movie. That, to my mind was really a love story set against the background of the disaster. Having seen the earlier version, I was very reluctant to watch the new one, but I did.

There are all sorts of things stuck in my memory from that earlier film. Not least was the calm assumption — "It'll be alright". This ship cannot sink. Until, of course, everyone realised that it could, and it was!

Many actions to save people were left until it was too late. When they tried to lower the life boats, it was women and children first. Some of the boats weren't full. The third class passengers on the lower decks were locked in. The rich had first call on the boats. And in the background, the orchestra played on. There weren't enough boats. This evoked either panic, or stoicism — try to survive at all costs, or calmly accept your fate.

Many of these images and memories from the movie are in my head when I listen to our noble leaders talking about the Climate Crisis.

The rich and powerful nations, who caused and are causing the problem, say to the victim nations — "It'll be alright". As sea levels rise and they find their homes changed into paddling pools. Within the rich nations, our noble multi-millionaire leaders assuring us, "It'll be alright". We won't put climate saving burdens on your backs. We, like the third class passengers, are locked on our decks.

We can't afford to introduce the necessary changes. We need more time. Slowly slowly. We can't afford not to take action now. It's already too late to stop all of the effects of Climate Breakdown. The United Nations is calling for countries to act together to slow down Climate warming. Although individuals, communities and individual nations can and must do what they can, it's only together that we can make the significant changes necessary.

But wait. What can I hear? Is that an orchestra playing on...?



<u>Charity Shops</u>: in Kingswood, Keynsham and Bath. Find pre-used good clothes/toys/books etc. And support a good cause.


Library of things: In Kingswood to borrow tools and equipment for any DIY, and even camping. Just need to join to borrow.

What is involved?

Governors do not need to be experts in the field of education, what is needed is an interest in the welfare of students together with the time and willingness to be involved. Your skills may be very useful as part of the Governing Body. Governors need to build relationships with a range of people, to be able to work as part of a team, to be able to question and the ability to make connections between different types of information.

The Governing Body is responsible for the conduct of the school and for promoting high standards and carries out its role by supporting the vision for the school and ensuring that the school works effectively towards achieving the vision. 
