Dear Friends

The last few mornings as I sat having breakfast I have been entertained by blackbirds, blue tits, and other birds flitting to and fro in the garden, feeding and importantly collecting material to build nests. The blackbird disappearing into the hedge with beak-fulls of grass, the crows on the chimney pots opposite with twigs; Busy, busy. Spring has come and with it the signs of new life as grass grows, trees bud, flowers burst into colour and the birds getting ready to lay their eggs for chicks to be born in a few weeks time.

The other day I was at the primary school with members of the church as we led the children of class 5 through the Easter story using a creative, interactive way exploring "Easter the movie". It was fun and the children entered into the story with interest.

As we finished all the scenes of the Easter movie, one question from the children was, "Why do we have Easter eggs"? and perhaps more difficult, "Why do we have Easter rabbits"? Do you know?

So why eggs? It is a sign of new life – the bird's eggs break as the chick hatches. Why rabbits? A sign of spring, when we see lots of baby rabbits, and new born lambs of course. Again, a sign of new life.

In the church Easter is the most important festival when we remember that Jesus died, (Good Friday) but then he rose again (Easter Day). Jesus came to life again; New life. And Christians believe he lives eternally, which means for all people the opportunity and welcome to new life.

By the time you read this Easter Day may have passed; However we celebrate Easter time and spring time, it is a time of new birth and new opportunities. Enjoy the signs in nature and you are most welcome to join in celebrating the new life Jesus gives us every Sunday at church or at other times and events advertised.
