Dear Friends,

What a lovely warm welcome we have received from the people of Wick, and the folk in the other churches in Doynton, Dyrham, Pucklechurch and Abson (who have the most beautiful snowdrops) of which I will be Priest in Charge. We've had people come calling to the house just to say hello to myself and my husband Rob, we've been brought cakes, flowers, apple juice from the famous Doynton Community Orchard and cards, all surrounded with love and good wishes.

Bishop Neil Warwick led my licensing service in Holy Trinity, Doynton and we had a great turn out, with people from across all the villages attending. Also my first service in Pucklechurch couldn't have gone better with so many people, again from all the villages, contributing. So as you can imagine I'm quite excited about my first service here in St Bartholomew's Church, which I will have had by the time you read this letter.

One of my visitors, a lovely lady who lives just across the road from the vicarage, brought me some books about the history of Wick. One of the books, "An Historical Walk through Wick High Street", written by her husband, Brian Mumford, tells of how the "cure of souls" in Wick came under the vicar of Pucklechurch up until a separate parish was created in 1880 and of how the patronage passed to the Simeon Trustees, who were trustees of my previous two churches in Liverpool. Now the patronage of the benefice belongs to the Simeon Trustees, the Lord Chancellor's Office since Wick parish joined with Doynton and M H W Blathwayt Esq representing Dyrham. Such an interesting tapestry of connections and relationships! These are so important in the building and sustaining of community and relationships. It is my hope and prayer that as we as churches develop stronger connections across the villages, many of you will join us, as I've no doubt there are lots of long standing relationships already in place.

Jesus was all about relationships. He continually lives in relationship with God the Father and the Holy Spirit and whilst on earth he formed close bonds with his disciples and He calls each one of us to come into relationship with Him too. So what better way to do that, than through the Church community, where you'll have an opportunity to connect with some wonderful people. News from St Bartholomew's

We have had such a lovely busy time over the last few weeks - but it will be good to settle back to something approaching "normal" in the weeks to come. As you will see from her letter on the previous page, Rev Elaine is now duly licenced and installed, and has taken up her responsibilities as "Priest-in-Charge" of all of us. Wish her luck, she's going to need it!

Having said that, of course, Lent is anything but "normal" - although the fashion for giving something up for Lent is evaporating, it is still a time of preparation, of having a good look at ourselves. There is a Lent group happening in the Chapel on Tuesday evenings, if you fancy exploring a little more deeply; you would be very welcome, and there are biscuits...

Lent leads us inevitably to Easter, and the contrast between the quiet contemplation of Lent with the joyous celebration of Easter is one of the best times of the church year! Have a look at the centre pages, see

if there is a service that you fancy going to, even if you don't go to church the rest of the year. The Easter Sunday service at St Bartholomew's is being taken by Rev Steve Britton, and he tells me that it will be a family-friendly service: toy lamb and chocolate egg hunting, a singalong to "O Happy Day!" and a Holy Communion to which all are welcome. - South Glos Council Local Plan phase 3: thank you to the 200+ residents who attended the drop-in session and public meeting in January. The PC has submitted its response to SGC based upon your feedback which is available on the PC's website.

Top gardening jobs for later in March

- Prune roses and buddleia
- Plant shallots, onion sets and early potatoes: Onions are such a versatile vegetable they feature in so many recipes, and growing your own means you'll always have them to hand.
- **Get some good compost** from the garden centre or supermarket. Save those yoghurt pots/milk cartons/meat trays, and...
- **Plant seeds in pots or trays indoors** for salad leaves to eat any time and tomato seeds to plant out later.


