The blackbirds are so adept at getting the bottoms off the feeders and letting all the nuts/seeds fall to ground, much to the delight of the other birds and squirrels. Three Shires Medical Practice

Practice Statement 17/6/2024

We've had a succession of contracts imposed on us which are insufficient to cover the rising costs of running a practice. The most recently imposed contract was rejected by 99% of BMA members. The BMA are currently consulting, with a view to deciding which form of industrial action will have to be taken.

Unlike most businesses, General Practice cannot mitigate against rising costs by passing these on to our customers, as the money we are paid is imposed on us unilaterally by the government.

We have had an independent review of our practice finances which has failed to identify any significant inefficiencies or un-tapped income streams in our business practice.

We have no plans to close any or all of our surgeries, but whether we ultimately have to will depend on whether current funding policies are changed to make the practices sustainable, which may depend on the impact of any industrial action and also on the new UK government future direction of travel regarding its approach and funding for general practice.

It is worth noting that the Three Shires is far from alone in facing these difficulties which are shared by many, if not the majority, of practices at the moment, with many unfortunately facing certain or probable closure. This is the current position.

It should be remembered that for the practice partners, the business is our entire livelihood and we are not going to let the practice collapse due to a lack of interest or effort.

We are having to live with the current uncertainty, just as you are, which is a cause of significant stress and unhappiness.



- **Brockwell Park:** to improve accessibility, the PC plans to install a new tarmac path from the car park to the play area, and to clear and re-instate the original path up to the patio area at the top of the park. Following feedback from Friends of Wick Village, the PC has asked Commons Connections to move two timber posts at the bottom of the wildflower strip to improve vehicular access, and to provide additional bench seating.
- First aid training: the PC is arranging an evening session in early September to cover CPR, staunching blood loss, and using a defibrillator. This will be a free, 90 minute session. Watch out for more details later.
- **Councillor vacancy:** the Parish Council has a vacancy for a Councillor. To qualify, you must be at least 18 years of age; a British, Commonwealth, Republic of Ireland or a qualifying EU citizen. You must also be on the parish Electoral Register; or have lived or worked in the parish; or owned or rented land in the parish; or lived within 4.8 kilometres of the parish, all for the last 12 months. Please contact The Clerk if interested.
- **Permissive path south of Naishcombe House:** the PC received a request to support an application to re-open this path, which it has declined. As a permissive path, the landowner has the right to close it off.
