## A moment to ponder

So, we are now in the Harvest Season - we all know the "mists and mellow fruitfulness" quote, from the famous poem by Keats, and there is something rather beautiful about the inevitable chilly mornings and cobwebs hung with diamonds. Harvest time when I was a child smelled very different to today: there were a LOT more bonfires, and we had a huge old apple tree that ripened all of a sudden, which meant we couldn't use or store all of the apples, and inevitably, they lay on the ground and fermented, much to the delight of many insects.

Our farmers, of course, have been harvesting mightily for months, and probably look at our sentimental ideas of "Harvest" with amusement. Our plan needs to address broader issues like preserving or recovering habitats and creating nature corridors where nature can thrive. ## **News from your Parish Council**

- Brockwell Park 1: to improve access, the Parish Council will install a new tarmac path from the car park to the play area, with new dropped kerbs, and to move the play area fence away from the slide.
- Brockwell Park 2: a working party has been organised by Cllr Stuart Fowell
  to clear the patio area at the top of the park. More support will be very
  welcome on Saturday 11 October 2024. Please bring garden tools.
- Village Hall: in August, works were completed to install extra purlins to the roof to strengthen it. By the time you read this, new solar PV will have been installed. Next, the car park will be resurfaced.
- Bleed kits: recently, several villagers called for a bleed kit to be installed at the village hall. The Parish Council consulted South West Ambulance Service who are concerned that there is no current national index of bleed kit locations unlike with defibrillators. Also, anyone sustaining a serious injury to an artery will likely bleed out within 30 to 60 seconds so running for a bleed kit located nearby puts the victim at greater risk. The advice is to improvise and immediately use any clean material or rolled bandages from a first aid kit to press on any penetrative wound or use a tourniquet on a limb to staunch the flow and call 999 or 112. This first aid method was highlighted to the 8 villagers who attended the free first aid session in early September. The PC will keep this matter under review.


