- Parish Councillors: welcome to James Baron who has volunteered and been co-opted as a Councillor. James's appointment brings the PC back up to full strength and he is looking forward to getting stuck in.
- **Brockwell Park:** thank you to Cllr Stuart Fowell for organising a small group of enthusiastic volunteers who cleared the top patio of overgrown vegetation (I hope he bought you all a pint afterwards Ed).
- Wick Sports Ground (WSG): to enable the clubhouse to be used for other
 activities, the PC is investing some £17.5k in repairs and improvements to
 the fabric of the building and car park. Though known mostly as the home
 of Wick Owls FC, WSG and the multi-use games area are used regularly for
 other sports by a variety of local groups.
- **Village Hall:** the new solar installation is generating and in the first week, reduced the hall's electricity costs by 90% (too early for any trends Ed).
- Hedgehog signs: you may have seen some 'SLOW DOWN FOR
 HEDGEHOGS' signs around the village. These have been sourced and
 funded by the PC following a request from our village hedgehog rescue
 team. Thanks are due to Cllr Pete Crew for sticking them up.
- Dog Poo: the PC provides dog poo bins around the village that are funded by council taxpayers who would be grateful if they were used rather than leaving it where it's dropped or bagged up and hung in hedges.
- **Defibrillators:** a new defib, co-funded by the PC, will be installed at St Bart's Church Hall shortly. Do you know where your nearest one is?
- Planning: still nothing (worryingly quiet Ed).

We are fortunate that Wick still has two bus services passing through six days a week. They may not be frequent, but they can get you to Bath or Kingswood if you don't have a car or want to use public transport. It is a small but significant way to save energy and reduce CO2.

The 35 bus from Marshfield to Kingswood has a new timetable and route since September.

The trip normally takes 17 minutes.

This route now diverts from the A420 between the ring road and Kingswood shops around Courtney Road on most trips, so you need to board at Kings Chase to come back. Going to Kingswood it drops you at Cecil Road, just behind the shops.


