

The service was written by women in the Cook Islands, so we had to grapple with some unfamiliar Maori names and pronunciations, which was fascinating. We were treated to a fantastic spread afterwards in the Chapel's newly decorated room, and we all had a lovely time!

Talking of nice food, and fun getting together with our Chapel family, the Lent group is going well; everyone I've spoken to about it says it is very enjoyable and informative. By the time this issue comes out, the meetings will have finished (I think the last one is on 1st April) and I'm sure that everyone involved will have gained something from it. All the Lent preparation leads to Easter of course - the most wonderful part of the church year! Details of all our Easter services are on the centre pages; do find one that sounds right for you, and come celebrate with us. Lamb-hunting, chocolate egg eating, you'll love it!

We have news about the churchyard, too - S Glos Council have offered support for our efforts to improve our biodiversity and we are working on a 5-year plan. Shortly we aim to plan a session or two to clear out several very overgrown areas and we shall be calling on people in the local community to help with this, so watch this space! These were very old and frequently leaked due to cracks in the old lead causing internal damage to the church. This was being exacerbated by the torrential rain from climate change which meant they also often overflowed.

The work was funded by the nearly £60,000 in grants and donations that we have managed to raise so far. We are now trying to raise a further £80,000 for the replacement of the lead on the tower roof. Environment challenge for April 2025

St Bartholomew's, WICK CHURCHYARD

There have been some informal meetings around the possibility of improving St Bartholomew's Churchyard area. There are a number of reasons for this:



- a) Much of the area behind the Church especially along the boundary has been neglected over the years and desperately needs attention
- b) Some trees and other bushes in-front of the Church are very overgrown and actually block the view to the Church completely which need reducing or even removing (if permitted)
- c) St Bartholomew's would like to enhance this area so it can be more eco-friendly, encourage all aspects of wildlife as well as generally improve the overall "look" of the large area which we have and make it a more enjoyable place to sit and contemplate, visit areas of remembrance, and even make use of the vast area at the back during summer months by making it more beautiful and accessible.

So far, a small team have visited the St Mary's Church in Marshfield – where they have already established areas of grass management, wild flowers, composting, bee hives etc, to enhance biodiversity.

We have also drawn up a plan of the area at St Bartholomew's as it is NOW, and would like to produce a plan to cover the next few years


There is a large area of snowdrops already growing (mainly hidden!) and small clusters have been re-planted around the Churchyard – ready for Spring 2026.

We have also had a visit from "Common Connections", part of South Gloucester Council, who have suggested that we plant some fruit trees behind the Church – and this is being planned now.

We NEED VOLUNTEERS to help us! This need not be that onerous - we get together every few months – but we do need help with planning and, maybe at this stage, more importantly, we need people with garden equipment – including chain saws/hedge cutters etc to try to create some clear ground where things are simply too overgrown – as well as helpers to carry cuttings to a bonfire etc.....so we are asking for a workparty or two to help us get this underway......

Two new neighbourhoods with a total of 1,930 homes are planned for land east of the A4174 ring road between the B4465 and Carsons Road, while North Warmley New Neighbourhood will be created with 1,060 homes.

The plan said South Gloucestershire's population was forecast to increase to more than 350,000 over the next two decades, while 5,800 families were currently on the housing waiting list. The consultation period will open after full council approves the plan on February 12 before it is sent to the government's Planning Inspectorate for public examination in spring 2026.






