

Bumblebees give £600 million of services to UK crop production each year



The UK has 24 different types of bumblebee, 8 are common and widespread, 8 more are rare and less widespread. In the area covered by the Parish News, these are easily identified, Buff-tailed, Red-tailed and Common carder.

The Bumblebee Conservation Trust has an excellent free app to help with identification of these and others.

80% of crop pollination is done by bumblebees, that includes gardeners growing tomatoes, strawberries, raspberries, apples and runner beans.

Bumblebees are super pollinators as they have large hairy bodies, their buzzing frees more pollen from flowers and they fly when the weather is cool.

They also have 5 eyes, two large compound ones and three more on the top of the head. The eyes on top of the head are involved in navigation.

Bumblebee colonies die at the end of the year. A new Queen spends the winter hibernating in or on the ground. Leaving areas of the garden untidy will increase the chance of the successful pollination of next year's crops.

Bumblebee Queens will be active during late Winter/early Spring looking for nest sites. They fly in a zig zag pattern close to the ground, looking, smelling and investigating.

Environmental challenge September 2025

"Every minute, the equivalent of one garbage truck of plastic is dumped into the ocean": UNEP



A crucial international meeting of the

Intergovernmental Negotiating Committee on Plastic Pollution (INC), took place in Geneva from August 5-14 to finalize a global treaty aimed at reducing plastic pollution. The treaty aims to address the entire lifecycle of plastics, from production to disposal, and to establish legally binding targets for countries to meet. A key focus is on limiting plastic production, addressing harmful chemicals in plastics, and establishing consistent design standards for plastic products to improve recyclability. 183 countries participated- it's that serious!!! The meeting ended without an agreed treaty, but with a desire to continue working towards one. Disappointing maybe?

We all use plastics; they are both useful and a problem. So>>>> What can you do to reduce plastic waste?

Single-use plastic is the biggest contributor to plastic waste in the environment, and much of our daily consumption of this comes from food packaging.

- 1. RE-USE: You can take a reusable container or cup if you are getting a takeaway. Polystyrene and black plastic containers are worst for the environment. When food shopping consider taking a reusable sealable bag to weigh your fruit and vegetables.
- 2. WALK: It is estimated, that more than a quarter of microplastics in the environment come from car tyres. For those that are able, walking and cycling to the local shops or sharing car journeys with friends or neighbours can help.
- 3. WASH LESS: Modern clothes are part plastic (e.g., polyester) and when we wash them fibres and microplastics get into the waste water and eventually the rivers and sea. It's estimated 35% come from clothes. (Then we eat the fish!). To reduce this impact, consider washing clothes less frequently, using full loads and opting for lower temperatures.
- 4. THINK: Are there alternatives I can use to reduce my plastic use?

Stop Press: At St Bartholomew's church we are putting in measures to increase biodiversity in our church land. Later this year we will have a day for hedge planting and bulb planting etc. (Date to be confirmed) Come and participate and have a look.
