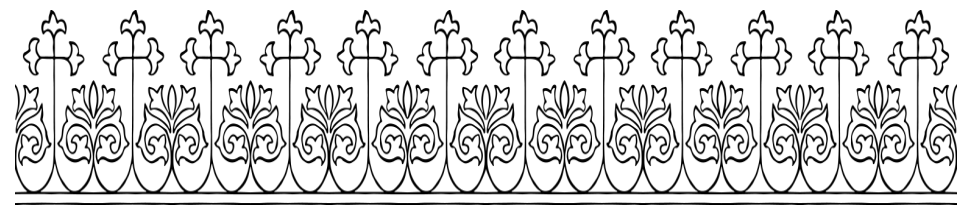

Would you like to know more about Jesus and Christianity? Come to the Alpha course at the church on a Wednesday. It's free and full of Hope. (see advert on page 16)

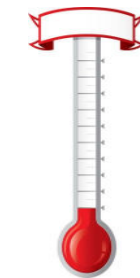

Doynton Village Market: the lead up to Christmas proved to be very well attended. We would like to say a big thank-you to all of you who visited us: to us it makes our little market seem special, and it is always a joy to see new faces as well as our regulars. This report has been written following the first market of 2026. Usually we have a slow start to the year, but we were able to have fresh sausages and pork joints available, and one producer had put her recent sourdough baking course to the test by

bringing and selling some lovely loaves. We also cater for the vegetarians and those who are gluten-intolerant, and this market was no exception, with vegetarian/vegan Scotch eggs on sale as well as the usual pies/pasties/frittatas and a nice cheesecake. It is also Seville orange season, and we had some lovely looking marmalades, as well as our usual preserves and chutneys. Our very talented crafters produce lovely cards for all occasions, as well as paintings and knitted and sewn items. The crafters will often take on commissions, in fact most, if not all, our producers will make something to order. I mustn't forget the lovely aromas coming from the wax melts stall, always good as a gift for someone. Last but not least, we always seem to have a full vegetable table at the start of the market, which is invariably empty come the end. The next markets are on **February 7th and 21st and March 7th and 21st**, we hope to see you there!

Doynton and Wick WI enjoyed a delicious Christmas meal at the Cross House in December, and then met up again at Wick Chapel in January for an evening of stories and songs from the shows performed by professional actor Ben Stock, who was brought up in Wick and still calls many of the audience “Auntie”. - **Wick Sports Ground, Oldbury Lane:**
Just a reminder that the recently refurbished clubhouse at the sports ground is available to hire for meetings, parties, celebrations, events and social get togethers, as is the floodlit multi-use games area.

- **Wick Village Hall, Manor Road:**
A year of monitoring the bowed rear wall of the hall has found no structural movement. Consequently, no action is required but the PC will continue to monitor this periodically.

The annual report to the Charity Commission (CC) was approved by the PC at the December meeting. The report is available on the CC website.
- **Brockwell Park – Green Canopy Project:**
The project will focus on clearing the scrub area at the top of Brockwell Park, installing a new stock fence, planting the fenceline with additional native hedge whips, and the rest of the area with native trees, notably Field Maple and Black Poplar, extinct in UK until recently. This will be funded by the PC but reimbursed via a grant from DEFRA.
- **Planning applications:**
P25/02586/HH Rock Mount, Rock Road, Wick: single storey side extension for additional living accommodation and a 1.8m high wall – *no objection*.

P25/02535/F Tracy Park, Bath Road, Wick: replacement of golf green and bunker with ornamental lake of same size with fountain – *no objection*.

Christmas Sale: It seems a while ago, but we had a wonderful afternoon at the end of November at our Christmas Sale, with friends, families, and members of the village. The people kept on coming... We are always amazed by and grateful for the number of people who support us. WE RAISED **£1400** – a huge effort by just a few.

Doynton and Wick W.I. held a Carol Service at the Chapel early in December. Friends joined them, together with members of Wick Village W.I.

Christmas Eve: Linda Byrne led a traditional Candlelit Carol Service. It was good to see some familiar faces from the village. We heard poems, readings, sang Carols and Rob sang a solo. The collection raised £100 and we were able to send this amount plus a part of the amount raised at the W.I. Carol service (£57) to Embrace the Middle East.

We look back at the work carried out at the Chapel over 2025: We replaced a downpipe, fitted a new notice board, carried out necessary electrical work and installed a hot water system. At the beginning of January, the asbestos was removed from the boiler house. **Future work:** A fence to be fitted at the bottom of the garden (We are grateful to the Parish Council for the grant of £1095). External work is needed on the large window in the sanctuary. The jobs are endless. As always – our thanks to everyone who contributed to the life of the Chapel during 2025 – what would we do without you all?

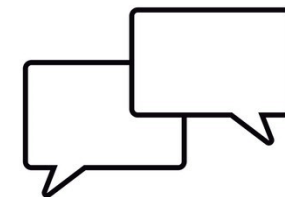

Environmental challenge February 2026

I begin the year feeling rather sad. **Sad** about plastic waste in the environment. On a global scale:

There are massive amounts of plastic in the ocean, with estimates ranging from 75 to 199 million tons of total plastic, and over 171 trillion individual pieces floating around, including trillions of microplastics. Some are concentrated in The Great Pacific Garbage Patch which is **617,763 square miles**, around **3 times the size of France**. It contains **8 trillion bits** of plastic, weighing more than **80,000 tonnes**.

(Have you watched the 2nd episode of BBC drama "War between the land and sea", where the AQUA people rain the oceans' plastic and rubbish on the cities of the world- terrifying).

What may sadden us more is what we see around Wick, Doynton, Abson, Dyrham and surrounds.

Walk along Rock Road, Beech Road, Blue Lodge Road, Oldbury Lane, and etc, etc, and what do you see nestling in the hedges and grass verge?

Look at the entrances to the park, and outside the shops. Visit Raven's Rock (below it is like a rubbish tip) Drive further afield to road junctions with the A46. I could go on.....



It is **sad** that people just throw, dump, leave rubbish anywhere, even if there is a bin for rubbish nearby. Why throw bottles and cans out of a car window? Why do this? Lack of knowledge? Swifts, Swallows and House Martins- Spring is on its way



Each spring, our Swifts, Swallows and House Martins make an amazing journey from Africa back to the UK. They fly thousands of miles to enjoy the British summer where there are more insects to feed to their young.

Swifts leave Africa usually in April, and travel about 6,500 miles. They often cross the Channel to the west, arriving in southwest England or Wales in May. Swifts have a high pitched screaming call and can eat, drink, and even sleep while flying!

Swallows usually leave southern Africa in February or March and travel about 6,000 miles. Many cross the English Channel at Dover, the narrowest part of the Channel, flying from France into southeast England. They arrive in the UK around April. Swallows often return to the same nest each year.

House Martins set off in March and fly around 5,000-6,000 miles. They also often cross the Channel at Dover, though some arrive further west. By late April or early May, they reach the UK and begin building their mud nests under house roofs. House Martins work as a team, sharing mud and even helping to repair each other's nests.

By late summer, all three birds begin their long journey back to Africa [some Swallows and House Martins now may spend winter in Spain/Portugal] to avoid our winter. Their departure tells us that autumn is on its way.

Have you ever thought about popping in to the market in the Village Hall? It sounds delicious!

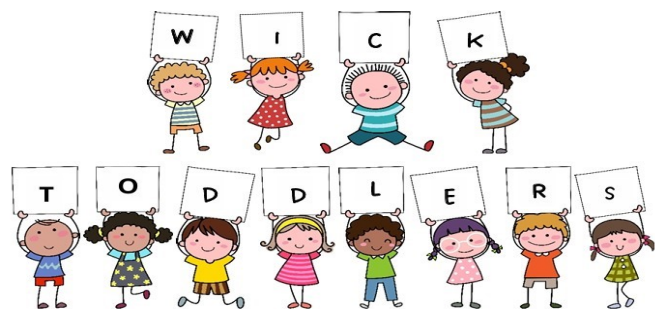

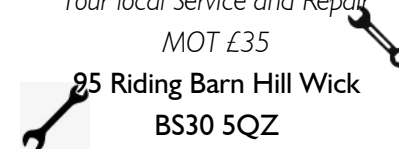
